

# Frequently Asked Questions Frequent Findings and Citations

January 2025 (revised)

1. If we receive a finding from a site visit for violations of the CAAHEP Standards, is the program placed on probation?

Absolutely not. Findings require a response to CoAEMSP that provides evidence the program has met the request for additional information or changes. It is a normal part of the process, and the program is provided ample opportunity to submit the requested information. A finding does not prevent the program from achieving initial or continuing accreditation status.

2. The site visit team told us about potential findings, when do we learn about the details?

Following the site visit, the program receives an email that includes the Site Visit Report and the Site Visit Findings Letter, identifying potential Standards violations and the rationale. The program is asked to confirm the factual accuracy of the findings and respond to the Site Visit Findings Letter. The forms for each step are included, along with the instructions for submission and the due dates.

The site visit team verbally reviews potential findings at the exit summation of the site visit.

3. What is the difference between findings in the Site Visit Findings Letter after the site visit and the citations in the letter from CAAHEP awarding accreditation?

When a program receives a findings from the site visit, they submit a response to the Site Visit Findings Letter with the requested evidence. The information provided by the program is reviewed by a team of CoAEMSP Board Members. If the evidence is sufficient, the program is placed on the next CoAEMSP Board Meeting and a recommendation forwarded to CAAHEP for its review and a recommendation for an accreditation status.

If the evidence provided by the program is not considered to be adequate, the program is forwarded to CAAHEP for review and action for accreditation with a requirement to submit a Progress Report providing the additional requested information.

4. How many programs do not receive a finding as part of the site visit process?

In a recent 12-month period, 112 programs participated in a site visit and 46 had zero findings (41%) at the time of the site visit.

5. How many individual findings were documented in this 12-month period?

There was a total of 367 findings across the 66 programs with findings.

The most common number of findings ranged from one to three.

## 7. How many programs successfully addressed the initial finding(s) in the Response to the Findings Letter and were sent to CAAHEP with no findings?

In a recent 12-month period, 136 programs submitted progress reports and 91 (67%) were cleared with no remaining findings.

For the 45 programs with remaining findings, there were 160 citations to address in progress reports.

#### 9. Who are the site visitors? How do they know how to evaluate our program?

Site visitors are your peers who are experienced program directors or medical directors or who would qualify as a program director or medical director with experienced in EMS educational programs. Interested individuals apply. The CoAEMSP Board of Directors reviews the applications and invite selected individuals to participate in a site visitor training workshop. Site visitors participate in regular sessions to stay current. Site visitors use a standardized report based on the CAAHEP Standards for the EMS Professions. The Site Visit Report is available <a href="here">here</a>. Evidence of compliance with the Standards is evaluated through documentation, conversation, and observation.

- Stay current with the CoAEMSP Policies and Procedures.
- Review the Site Visit Report and assess your program.
- Attend or watch the webinars presented by CoAEMSP.
- Review the CoAEMSP e-newsletters.
- Maintain student, cohort, and other program files in an accessible location to program personnel with a secure backup.
