# What is Accreditation – and Why??

"Accreditation" is a review of the quality of higher education institutions and programs. In the United States, accreditation is a major way that students, families, government officials, and the press know that an institution or program provides a quality education.

### Why is Accreditation Important?

For the **public**  $\rightarrow$  promotes the health, safety and welfare of patients in the pre-hospital setting by assuring competent Paramedics For **prospective students**  $\rightarrow$  serves a consumer protection purpose. It provides assurance that the program has been evaluated and has met accepted standards established by and with the profession For **prospective employers**  $\rightarrow$  assurance that the curriculum covers essential skills and knowledge needed for today's jobs For **graduates**  $\rightarrow$  promotes professional mobility and enhances employment opportunities in positions that base eligibility upon graduation from an accredited program

### Why is Accreditation Important?

For **practitioners**  $\rightarrow$  involves practitioners in the establishment of standards and assures that educational requirements reflect the current training needs of the profession For the **profession**  $\rightarrow$  advances the field by promoting standards of practice and advocating rigorous preparation For the **technical colleges, colleges, and universities**  $\rightarrow$  provides a reliable basis for inter- and intra-institutional cooperative practices, including admissions & transfer of credit For the **faculty and administrators**  $\rightarrow$  it promotes ongoing self-evaluation and continuous improvement and provides an effective system for accountability For the **program**  $\rightarrow$  enhances its national reputation and represents peer recognition

# **History and Formation**

 Originally the Committee on Allied Health Education Accreditation (CAHEA), a committee of the AMA

 In 1994, spun off from the AMA, and reorganized as the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs, a 501(c)3 organization

# **CAAHEP Recognition**

- Similar to what CAAHEP accredited programs go
- through, CHEA requires:
- CAAHEP submit a self-study
- Respond to request for information
- Report outcomes
- Follow up with progress reports



### **CAAHEP Structure**

- **Committees on Accreditation (CoAs)**
- 25 total CoAs
  - increase of 35% over past 10 years
  - 4 review programs in multiple, related professions
- 32 professions represented
  - increase of 33% over past 10 years
- 3 largest professions: EMS-Paramedic, Medical Assisting, Surgical Technology


