

Implementation Schedule: Submitting the LSSR for the Letter of Review

Before April 1, 2024, use the 2015 Standards

Between April 1 and December 31, 2024, may choose to use the 2015 or the 2023 *Standards*

After January 1, 2025, use the 2023 Standards



Implementation Schedule: Submitting the I/CSSR for accreditation

Receive a notice to submit an I/CSSR:

On or before October 1, 2023, use the 2015 *Standards*

November-December 2023, may choose to use either the 2015 or the 2023 *Standards*

On or after January 1, 2024, use the 2023 Standards



Implementation Schedule

Early adopters may select either the 2015 or 2023 *Standards*

After July 1, 2024, all I/CSSRs must be submitted based on the 2023 *Standards*

After January 1, 2025, all Letter of Review SSRs must be submitted based on the 2023 *Standards*



Revised/Added Responsibilities of Sponsor: Preparedness Plan

Added:

"have a preparedness plan in place that assures continuity of education services in the event of an unanticipated interruption"





Revised/Added Minimum Expectations Statement

Revised:

required minimum goals and expectations statement to remove the exit points at EMT, AEMT, or EMR language

VERBATIM:

"To prepare Paramedics who are competent in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains to enter the profession."



Revised/Added Advisory Committee

Removed:

- key governmental official representative
- fire/police representative





Revised/Added Clinical Coordinator

Added:

program identifies assignment of clinical coordinator responsibilities

This is not a requirement for a new position; however, the responsibilities must be identified and assigned to a faculty member



Revised/Added Curriculum

Appendix B reflects the curriculum / competencies from the National EMS Education Standards







Standard: Medical Director must be board certified

Guideline: in EMS medicine or emergency medicine

Associate Medical Director changed:

"authorized to practice in the state in which assigned program activities occur"





Assistant Medical Director language added:

"...participating in clinical rotations, field experience, and capstone field internship"





Added:

occupational risks





Outcomes reporting language expanded:

"If established outcomes thresholds are not met, the program must participate in a dialogue with and submit an action plan to the CoAEMSP that responds to the identified deficiency(ies). The action plan must include an analysis of any deficiencies, corrective steps, and a timeline for implementation. The program must assess the effectiveness of the corrective steps."
